Founded in 1950, Senior Community Services provides a vital safety net to assist seniors who wish to remain in their own home, with dignity and maximum independence, while empowering caregivers with support and education so they can continue to care for their loved ones.

SUCCESSES!

HOME Program: 1,321 served

Seniors remained safe, healthy and content in their own homes through the *Household and Outside Maintenance* program.

Senior Outreach & Caregiver Services: 759 participants

Older adults and their caregivers received life-enhancing guidance and support from licensed social workers through *Senior Outreach and Caregiver Services*.

CareNextion: Registered Users: 9,335

More than nine-thousand caregivers efficiently managed the care of a loved one by utilizing *CareNextion.org*, Senior Community Services' free, helpful and secure online tool.

Medicare Partners (Formerly Senior Partners Care): 1,034 served

Medicare Partners helped *more than one thousand seniors*, facing burdensome medical bills, by negotiating reduced balances that were more affordable for the participants.

Senior Centers: 16,380

More than sixteen-thousand older adults enjoyed *socialization and fun activities* at local Senior Centers, reducing loneliness and isolation.

Total Volunteers: 3,239
