If you have expertise in these topics, we especially encourage your proposals to center them. However, we encourage creativity and will consider proposals on any topic related to aging/caregiving and technology that may interest our audience.

- **Artificial intelligence:** Seniors are simultaneously intrigued and skeptical of AI. Share what AI is, how it can be used, how to spot AI-generated images and videos, or other information/insights.
- **Fraud and scam prevention:** The tactics scammers use to get money change by the year. Share the latest updates on what scammers are doing to exploit older adults, how they can lower their risk, and what to do if they're taken advantage of. This is consistently our most popular topic.
- **Technology in the healthcare system:** Familiarize the crowd with the technology that is helpful to know about when they're navigating the healthcare system like MyChart, virtual appointments, and more.
- **Caregiving:** Tools for online or long-distance caregiving, platforms to make caregiving easier, online resources for caregivers to maintain their mental health and well-being.
- **Navigating retirement when off-line options are disappearing:** The emotional frustration of basic necessities moving online like Social Security, MyChart, DocuSign for any contracts, and how people can navigate the new reality.
- **Social media literacy & safety:** Identifying real versus fake/AI generated images and videos, identifying real news versus misinformation, basics of fact-checking.
- **Entertainment:** How attendees can take advantage of technology to combat isolation and boredom.
